

Nairobi Framework Implementation

Work Programme 2010

The Nairobi Framework work programme 2010 highlights what activities the partners are implementing in collaboration with organisations or governments with the aim of responding to the objectives of the framework:

1. Capacity building in developing CDM projects
2. Build and enhance capacity of CDM DNAs to become fully operational
3. Promote investment opportunities for CDM projects
4. Improve information sharing, outreach, exchange of views on activities, education and training
5. Inter-agency coordination

Most of the partners are focussing on activities that address capacity building in developing CDM projects covering regions in Africa, Caribbean, Pacific, and Latin America. Technical assistance is provided to targeted countries to build capacity in project identification, design and implementation to be able to participate in the carbon market. Other areas include strengthening the institutional and technical capacities of DNAs in selected countries, training workshops for project developers and other stakeholders are planned or already held on developing PDDs, PoA development, SD criteria, CDM project review and approval process, and legal and legislative requirements.

Tools and information products are being developed such as CDM investor guide, methodology selection tool, brochures, publications; e-learning, knowledge management platforms established to exchange information on best practices and lessons learned, including south and south exchanges.

There are initiatives to promote investment opportunities for CDM through carbon forums and facilities such as the Africa Carbon Asset Development (ACAD) offer innovative ways for collaboration with African financial institutions and local project developers to enhance their awareness and expertise to invest in the African carbon market. Another facility is the Millennium Development Goals Carbon Facility (MDGCF) that aims to catalyse investment opportunities for CDM project in under represented countries.

Description of activities	The proposed CDM capacity-building component, to be implemented by UNEP Risoe Centre, will enable the targeted ACP countries to fully participate in the global carbon market. By the end of the Action, host countries (targeted directly) will be able to identify, design, approve, finance, implement and monitor CDM projects that both address their sustainable development priorities and offer a cost-effective option for carbon credit buyers to comply with their obligations under the Kyoto Protocol. The proposed activities will emphasise the development of a national CDM portfolio of projects that could be marketed in international carbon events such as the Carbon Expo, and could be posted on each country's Designated National Authority (DNA) website. Other countries will also have significant level of capacity developed in these areas.

Description of activities	<p>The ACAD Facility is an innovative public-private partnership that collaborates with African financial institutions and local project developers to enhance their awareness, expertise, and investment willingness in the African carbon market. ACAD's strategy draws upon three complementary support lines: risk and transaction cost sharing, technical assistance to project developers, and targeted training and outreach for financial institutions. A focus on replicable and sustainable demonstration projects is a cornerstone of ACAD's strategy. Financial institutions and the investment community look toward concrete success stories of the benefits that carbon finance can bring. By supporting a pool of projects that are innovative and easy to replicate elsewhere, ACAD aims to mobilise greater investment and stimulate similar ventures in Africa, thereby decreasing project development costs.</p> <p>ACAD will partner with, and train local financial sector players on how to tap into carbon finance opportunities. For example, some 30 participants from financial institutions across Africa took part in ACAD's first training event on October 21st, 2009 in Cape Town. An additional training event is scheduled for March 2, 2010. A number of other regional investor outreach and mobilization activities are planned for 2010, including the 2nd African Bankers' Carbon Investment Forum, which will take place in October 2010. It is expected that other Nairobi Framework partners will co-sponsor this high-profile event for the African financial and investment community.</p>
