## Winners



**FIRST PLACE: Wambi Michael** is an award-winning journalist based in Kampala. In 2007, he won the Investigative Journalist of the Year award. Currently, he works for the Uganda Radio Network News Agency as a journalist and producer of the National Perspective weekly radio magazine, which is broadcast by 32 radio stations and Uganda's public broadcaster, Uganda Broadcasting Service. He has been reporting on environmental issues for more than ten years. He is one of the Ugandan correspondents of Inter Press Services (IPS).



**SECOND PLACE: Emmanuel Okella** is an independent journalist and producer with ten years of experience. He is based in Kampala and works as news editor/environmental journalist at Radio Simba-Uganda. Okella is also the African Correspondent of the American-based Free Speech Radio News covering stories from the Great Lakes Region. He has served as a journalism training mentor for the BBC World Service Trust and Farm Radio International. In 2004, he won an award for radio reporting (environment category) in an annual journalism competition organized by the American Embassy in Uganda. In 2011, he was the winner of the CDM African Radio Contest.



**THIRD PLACE: Jonathan Mwanzia Nzomo** is a radio presenter working for Rahma Broadcasting Limited and he is based in Mombasa, Kenya. He holds a degree in mass communication from the Mombasa Polytechnic University College (MPUC). In the past five years he has been working as a reporter, editor and news anchor at Radio Rahma. He has a keen interest in issues related to development. This was his first participation in an international radio contest.
