Christiana Figueres, the UNFCCC Executive Secretary, is a leader in the global climate change field and a former member of the CDM Executive Board. A native of Costa Rica, she has been an official negotiator of the UNFCCC and Kyoto Protocol since 1995. In 2008, she was elected Vice President of the Bureau of the Conference of the Parties. She is also a widely published author on the design of climate solutions, and has been a frequent advisor to the private sector on how to play a leadership role in mitigation.



H.E. Fatou Ndeye Gaye is The Gambia's Minister of the Environment, Parks and Wildlife. She has been serving the government of The Gambia for over 30 years. From 2012 to 2013 she was Minister for Forestry and Environment. She served as a member of the CDM Executive Board from 2011 to 2012.
