Dear Sir/Madam,

Our input to the *call for public inputs on the definition of "special underdeveloped zones"* by the CDM Executive Board at its sixty-six meeting is as the followings:

As contained in [annex 19](#) of the report of the thirty-fifth meeting of the small scale working group (SSC WG), for the conditions listed in the paragraph 10 satisfied by the *"special underdeveloped zones"* they might be combined into one:

1. If they between are in linear relationship or with similar trend, for instance, (d) the proportion of population with income less than USD 1 per day and (a) the average GNI per capita of the most recent 3 years should be in the linear relationship or with similar trend; or
2. If they are set element or mostly set element in a situation set happened at a zone, i.e. that the situation (a), (b), (c) and (e) would, but not necessarily, happen in a zone with the situation (d), for example, that the situation (e) might be not appeared in some zone at the same time.

Therefore, for either of the above the condition (d), if appropriate, shall be confirmed by statistic and analysis as the one remained after the combination.

It could be dealt with on a "case by case" basis if a rare or an unexpected occurrence took place in implementation.

For developing countries the best way for the related most recent data is preferred to be provided by the DNA of the host country and cross-checked with those, for example, from the statistical yearbook by DOE after when the condition (d) to be taken.

As for the undeveloped countries it is likely that they shall be identified directly by the CDP and relevant organization of UN as mentioned in the document.
