- Main issues discussed:
- List of sectoral scopes & tagging of methodologies
 - No general objection against the list of SS and the tagging of methodologies in the current draft
 - Key focus of the discussion was on the consequences, especially with regard to competence requirements
 - What is the definition and extent of "specific technical knowledge" and the interaction of this concept with the technical areas?



- Demonstration of competence
 - Guidance document
 - Guidance for the demonstration of competence is essential; enforcement of version 5 of the standard should be postponed until guidance is available
 - Guidance should allow for flexibility with regard to the demonstration of competence
 - Methods (para 96)
 - Chicken&egg concern with regard to para. 96 is addressed with the new wording inserted
 - Equivalent evaluation in para. 96 lit. a) should also be possible for DOEs
 - Is para. 96 lit. b) precise and flexible enough?
 - Include research in para. 96 lit b) (i)



Outsourcing

- Outsourcing should not be limited to group companies but be possible to any other legal entity
- Mixed views if outsourcing of the demonstration and evaluation of competence should be allowed or whether this can not be outsourced as a key management function

Transitional provisions

- Allow for grandfathering concerning the demonstration of competence
- Entry into force and time needed by DOEs to adjust to the new standard depends on the design of transitional arrangements
- Need for a transitional period during which versions 4 or 5 can be applied by the DOEs at their discretion?



Action points / Proposals

- Secretariat is asked to consider the proposed changes and clarifications provided by the DOEs and the DOE Forum
- Further input is required and asked for from DOEs with regard to the Guidance on the demonstration of competence
