We understand that Certified Emission Reduction (CER) will be issued according to the Project Cycle Procedure (PCP) and may take dates from Submission of Request as, (Days for Awaiting Scheduling: Pendency)+(Duration of Completeness Chack of upto 7 days)+(Duration of Information & Reporting Check of upto 23 days)+(Period of Requesting for Review of 30 days), total Pendency period +58 days. We also learned that length of pendency once hit its maximum of 30 days in last August but it had been drastically reduced by the various measures implemented by the secretariat as short as less than 25 days at the beginning of December.

Taking maximum length of pendency of 30 days, for safty's sake, we, Marubeni setup the business plan from verification and delivery of CER for the KP's first committenet period to the market, i.e. 30+7+23+28 = 88 days, in September, 2012.

Howver, processing of the requests of issuance was suddenly stopped at the end of first week of December 2012 and such situation continued up to 8th January 2013 (Japan time). Due to such situation length of pendency extended to 53 days that is almost the same length, i.e. 58 days, of processing defined in PCP as of 8th January 2013. What we understood by the paragrapf 19 of the report of 70th meeting of CDM-EB that CDM-EB did not agree to stop processing of requests for issuance up to the end of last December as quoted below and the length of pendency was expected by thwe secretariat as short of less than 15 days at the 70th EB meeting.

(Quote from 70th Report of EB meeting: 19 The Board took note of an update by the secretariat on the current status of project-related submissions and timelines, in particular that approximately 1,900 requests for registration have been submitted to date during the second half of 2012, and that this high monthly rate has continued in November. The Board expressed its appreciation for the secretariat's effort and commitment to keep waiting times for new requests for registration and issuance as low as possible and requested the secretariat to take further measures to prioritize the processing of requests for registration until 31 December 2012.)

Delay of issuance affects a lot of damages financially to the CDM participants. As stated in EU directive, EU-ETS Phase II, which covers 80% of the entire CDM market for the compliance, will end at the end of April, 2013. Also to the Japanese market, which covers another 20% of the entire CDM market for the compliance, the damage is tremendous because its compliance period will end at the end of June, 2013. If the delay will continuously happen, the market players, or UNFCCC project participants who expect UN's normal working speed will hugely be damaged financially because they have to re-arrange their portfolio.
