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Revision of crediting period from 10 years fixed to Renewable crediting period (7x3) 21 years for registered projects.

The current regulations, based on paragraph 49 of the CDM modalities and procedures, allow for two mutually exclusive options with regard to crediting periods: either a maximum of 7 years renewable at most two times (a total of 21 years) or a maximum term of 10 years not renewable. Once the option is made at the registration of the CDM project activity, **there are no procedures that allow for such a change**.

Please provide any specific suggestions or further information which would address the issue raised in the previous section, including the exact reference source and version (if applicable).

Rationale: The current carbon market scenario has seen a reduction in CER prices upto 90%, thus there are many projects which have applied a 10 year fixed crediting period hoping for a CER price which would have made the project financials strong, however if these projects get an option to revise the crediting period to 7 x 3 renewable, thus the long term CER income shall enhance the project feasiblity.

Guideline: As per VVS version 5, section 9.5 (Post- Registration Changes) – currently there is no provision to seek revision in a Registered project which has applied a fixed crediting period to revise and apply renewable crediting period for 7 x 3 (21 years).

Suggestion: Requesting the CDM board to allow for a procedure to change the crediting period from fixed 10 years to 21 years (7 x 3) for a registered CDM project so as to provide an incentive to the PP who have been affected due to drastic reduction in CER prices.
