Expected benefits of the recent simplification of the CDM

Background

- CDM Executive Board (EB) adopted two sets of framework regulatory documents for the CDM at EB 93:
 - Project standard (PS), validation and verification standard (VVS) and project cycle procedure (PCP) for project activities
 - PS, VVS and PCP for programmes of activities (PoAs)
- The new PS, VVS and PCP entered into force on 1 June 2017
- Transitional period until 28 March 2018
- The new PS, VVS and PCP introduced various simplification to the CDM rules



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1. Structural improvement

- a) Clear separation of regulatory documents for PoAs and for project activities
- b) Clarification of applicable requirements for PoAs:
 - At the PoA level
 - At the generic CPA level
 - At the specific-case CPA level
- c) Incorporation of some standards (PoA, bundling), amendments and clarifications



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- 2. Substantive improvement (simplification and streamlining)
 - a) Changes to PoA rules
 - Inclusion of CPAs and post-registration changes to CPAs are no longer subject to mandatory assessment by the secretariat/Board
 - Inclusion of automatically additional CPAs directly by CME
 - Re-inclusion of excluded CPAs possible
 - b) Changes to post-registration changes rules
 - Free choice of "prior-approval track" and "issuance track"
 - Updating version or changing to another methodology possible anytime
 - No limitation to the delay to the start of crediting period



- 2. Substantive improvement (simplification and streamlining)
 - c) Validation and verification requirements
 - On-site inspection is optional except for certain conditions
 - More options for sampling-based validations and verifications
 - d) Other rules
 - Extended validity of applied methodology for resubmission of requests for registration
 - More flexibility in bundled SSC project activities
 - Optional monitoring sustainable development co-benefits
 - Elaboration of local stakeholder consultation process
 - Improvement in modalities of communication (MoC) process



Impacts

The new CDM regulatory framework will:

- Provide more flexibility to CDM project participants in registering projects, changing design of registered projects and requesting issuance of CERs
- Reduce cost for CDM project participants and DOEs to participate in the CDM
- Speed up the CDM process
- Provide more clarity in CDM regulations



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
