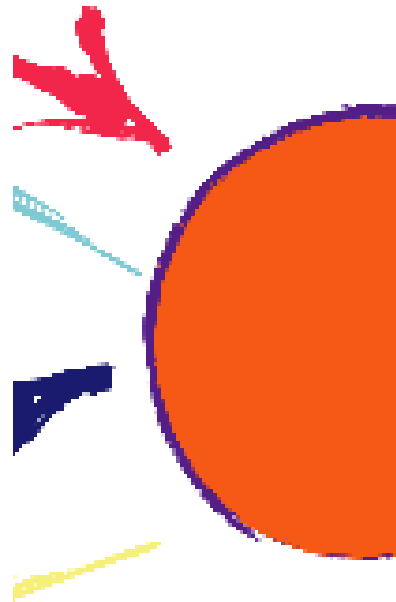


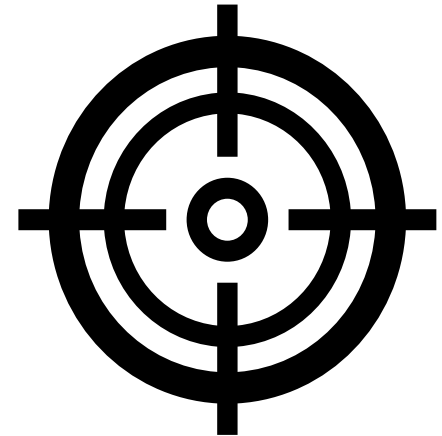
DNA Forum Interaction at EB 110

17 May 2021



Aim of the presentation

- To convey the key messages from DNAs on the CDM, collected through a call for input launched in April 2021 (9 responses received from: Bangladesh, Brazil, Burundi, Dominican Republic, Finland, Guinea, Spain, Switzerland, and Viet Nam);
- To deliver suggestions to the Board on what they could do to address the concerns/suggestions of the DNAs;
- To receive feedback from the Board.



DNA inputs to EB 110 (1/4)



Temporary measures:

- Represent a temporary relief;
- Make clear that substantive guidance is needed from the CMP before any decision can be taken by the Board on issuance or new registration of activities for which emission reductions are/will be achieved post-2020;
- Project participants are concerned about taking risk under the temporary measures and the fate of these activities;
- Uncertainty about the long-term CDM continuation and the transition of CDM to Article 6 mechanism under the Paris Agreement still remains.

DNA inputs to EB 110 (2/4)



Consideration of new projects:

- Some DNAs are issuing letter of approval for new activities for which emission reductions will be achieved post-2020 and will continue to do so until the negotiation of Article 6 is complete;
- Some DNAs ceased to issue letter of approval for new activities, as the second commitment period is over;
- A respondent DNA is yet to decide whether to continue issuing letter of approval for new activities.

DNA inputs to EB 110 (3/4)



Regional CDM support:

- DNAs are receiving CDM capacity-building and technical support, in particular in developing new or updating existing standardized baselines;
- DNAs are receiving up to date information on the CDM;
- Suggestions:
 - More connection and matchmaking between the global South and global North;
 - More communication on RCC activities.
